| 2001 | A second doctoral program and one graduate institute were added. In the academic year of 2001, a "Doctoral Program in Coaching Science" and a "Institute of Sports Injury Prevention" were added, making the entire school consist of four departments and four graduate institutes. |
| 2002 | Dr. Chou Hong-Shi was appointed as the fourth president of the school. On July 1, the Ministry of Education appointed Dr. Chou Hong-Shi as the fourth president of the school. One department was established, and the Department of Sports Technology was reorganized into three departments. In the academic year of 2002, the "Department of Adaptive Physical Education" was added. The "Department of Sports Technology" was reorganized into the "Department of Sports Training Science-Athletics," "Department of Sports Training Science - Balls," and "Department of Sports Training Science-Combats," making the entire school consist of seven departments and four graduate institutes, reaching the threshold for university status. |

In the academic year of 2003, the "Institute of Sports Technology" was added, and the "Department of Sports Management" was renamed the "Department of Recreation and Leisure Industry Management," making the entire school consist of seven departments and five graduate institutes. |
| 2004 | The "0826 National Sports University Olympic Day" was established. At the 2004 Athens Olympics, the school's alumni, Chu Mu-Yen, Chen Shih-Yuan, and Wu Hui-Ru, won gold in taekwondo, silver in men's archery team, and bronze in women's archery team, respectively. August 26, the day Chu Mu-Yen won the gold medal, was designated as "0826 National Sports University Olympic Day," with annual events held to celebrate and inspire. |
| 2005 | The school signed a sister school agreement with Ewha Womans University in Korea. |
| 2007 | The "Institute of Exercise and Leisure for the Disabled" was added, making the entire school consist of seven departments and six graduate institutes. The school signed a sister school agreement with Osaka University of Health and Sport Sciences in Japan. |
| 2008 | The school was merged and renamed "National Taiwan Sport University" On February 1, 2008, the Ministry of Education merged the "National College of Physical Education" and the "National Taiwan College of Physical Education" and renamed it the "National Taiwan University of Sport." The Ministry of Education specially appointed Dr. Chou Hong-Shi as the first president. The campuses were divided into "National Taiwan Sport University (Taoyuan)" and "National Taiwan Sport University (Taichung)." The school won two bronze medals at the Beijing Olympics. At the 2008 Beijing Olympics, Chen Wei-Ling and Chu Mu-Yen won bronze medals in weightlifting and taekwondo, respectively. Chu Mu-Yen became the first Taiwanese athlete to win both a gold and a bronze Olympic medal. The school signed sister school agreements with Indiana University in the United States, the Mongolian Champion Sports Institute, the University of Stirling in the United Kingdom, Chandrakasem Rajabhat University in Thailand, and California State University, Fullerton in the United States. |

| 2009 | | Renamed as "National Taiwan Sport University," the renaming ceremony took place on July 31, 2009. The university officially began operations on August 1, 2009, with the Ministry of Education appointing Dr. Chou Hong-Shi as the first president. In the academic year of 2009, the Department of Sports Health Management and the Institute of Sports Health Science were merged to form the "Department of Sports Health Management and the Graduate Program in Sports Health Management." The Department of Adaptive Physical Education and the Institute of Exercise and Leisure for the Disabled were merged to form the "Department of Adaptive Physical Education and the Graduate Program in Adaptive Physical Education," making the entire school consist of seven departments and four graduate institutes (seven undergraduate programs, eight master's programs, and two doctoral programs). The school signed sister school agreements with Kyungwoon University in Korea, University of The West in the United States, and the International Budo University in Japan. |
| 2010 | | Four colleges were established: College of Athletics: Sports Training Science-Combatss, Sports Training Science - Balls, Sports Training Science-Athletics; College of Health: Institute of Sport Science, Department of Sports Health Management; College of Management: Department of Leisure Industry Management; College of Physical Education: Institute of Physical Education, Department of Physical Education Promotion The school's mission is to be a "sports professional university oriented towards competitive sports and health leisure." On June 11, 2010, the Ministry of Education approved the establishment of a Master's program at the Institute of International Sports Affairs, under the College of Management (Tai-Gao(1) No. 0990094015A). The Ministry of Education appointed Dr. Kao Chin-Hsung as the fifth president of the school. |
| 2011 | | The school signed sister school agreements with the University of East-West Medicine in the United States, Ho Chi Minh City University of Sport in Vietnam, Beijing University of Physical Education in China, Springfield College in the United States, National Institute of Fitness and Sports in Japan, the National University of Malaysia, and Kasetsart University in Thailand. The school established core competencies and essential qualities for academic units Core Competencies: (1) Professional knowledge and application skills in sports (2) Creative thinking and problem-solving skills Essential Qualities: (1) Cultivation of teamwork spirit (2) The Olympic spirit (3) Cultivation of service and dedication spirit (4) Embracing the concept of sustainable development (5) Expanding international vision (6) Lifelong learning attitude |

On August 9, 2011, the Ministry of Education issued a letter (Tai-Gao(1) No. 1000139374-B) approving the renaming of the "College of Health" to the "College of Sports and Health Sciences" for the 2011 academic year.

On December 12, our student Tseng Ya-Ni won 11 world professional women's golf titles and was ranked No. 1 in the world for 44 consecutive weeks, earning the school special recognition. Tseng Ya-Ni was selected for the Hall of Fame, and December 12 was designated as "Sports University Yani Day."

In October, Tseng Ya-Ni, a student from the Department of Ball Sports, was selected as one of Time Magazine's 100 most influential people worldwide in 2012, ranking 17th. She was the only female athlete among the six athletes selected and the first person from the school to receive this honor.

In May, the PBL classroom and Micro-Classroom were established to provide a diverse learning environment.

In August, the Institute of International Sports Affairs was added; admissions were suspended in 2015.

2012

Sister school agreements were signed with Yokohama National University in Japan, University of Northern Colorado in USA, Hong Kong Baptist University, Guangzhou Sport University in China, Korea National Sport University, Capital University of Physical Education And Sports in China, and Jilin Sport University in China. In the 2012 academic year, there were adjustments to the college, department, and institute structure:

1. The "Institute of Coaching Science" and the "Institute of Sports Technique" were merged and renamed the "Graduate Institute of Athletics and Coaching Science" (including the Master's program, inservice Master's program, and Doctoral program).

2. The in-service Master's program under the College of Sports and Health Sciences was reorganized to enroll students at the college level. Admissions were suspended for the in-service Master's programs in the "Institute of Sport Science" and the "Department of Athletic Training and Health."

3. The Department of Adapted Physical Education was reorganized under the College of Physical Education.

In August, the in-service Master's program was added under the College of Sports and Health Sciences.

2013

In June, the new Library and Sports Museum was officially opened. In December, the first exhibition at the Sports Museum, co-organized with the Ministry of Education's Sports Administration, was launched: a special exhibition featuring memorabilia of golf champions Lu Liang-Huan and Tseng Ya-Ni.

Sister school agreements were signed with Shanghai University of Sport in China, Hungarian University of Physical Education, Chengdu Sport University in China, and Yong In University in Korea.

| 2014 | Sister school agreements were signed with MBS Munich Business School in Germany, Aalborg University in Denmark, Biwako Seikei Sport College in Japan, and the University of Georgia in USA. In January, the multifunctional learning classroom 418 in National Taiwan Sport University's administrative building was opened. In January, the public art "Iron Man at NTSU (Jhong Jheng Sports Park, Linkou)" was unveiled. An Indigenous Student Resource Center was established. In May, a ceremony was held for the opening of the new track and field stadium and the commencement of training for the 2017 Asian Youth Athletics Championship. In August, a Master's in-service program under the College of Management was added. On August 1, President Kao Chin-Hsung continued his term as president. | 2015 | In January, the university's Sports Division passed the Ministry of Labor's Workforce Development Agency TTQS Talent Development Quality Management Assessment (training institution version), with the approved content being a canyoning course organized by the Department of Industrial Economics. In May, after attending the "2015 Malaysia Games" in Taiwan, a delegation led by Dato' Seri Tiong King Sing, the Prime Minister's Special Envoy to East Asia, and including members of the Malaysian Parliament and Cabinet officials, visited Taiwan. They were accompanied by President Kao Chin- Hsung of our university on a visit to Legislative Yuan to meet with President Wang Jin-Pyng. In August, the Master's program in International Sports Affairs was added. In September, Prince Ahmad M. I. Abusheikha, Special Envoy of Jordan, visited the university along with Coach Chang Wen-Bin of the Jordan National Taekwondo Team and Wang Bo-Han, Chief of the Department of Asian Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, to discuss collaboration with President Kao Chin-Hsung. In November, the university held an opening ceremony for the Sports Museum, simultaneously unveiling the "Olympic Center" and the "Indigenous Student Resource Center." |

In February, National Taiwan Sport University's "automatic payment machines" were put into service. In March, the university's 10-meter airgun range was opened. In August, the International Sports Coaching Science Master's Program and the International Sports Management and Innovation PhD Program were added. In January, the "Huanyu Pavilion" was launched as a platform for brand storytelling and innovation in collaboration with the university's industry partners. In June, the Voice of NTSU radio station was launched. In July, the first Global Outdoor Adventure Leadership Program (G.O.A.L.) was held, with a successful conclusion on August 10. In March, the university was awarded three honors at the "Taiwan's Most Influential Academic Resources Awards": 1. Ist place for Knowledge Sharing, 2. 1st place for Best Academic Exposure, and 3. 4th place for Best Academic Communication. In April, the university completed the renovation of venues required for the 2017 Summer Universide (swimming, water polo, archery competition and practice venues, football practice venues, volleyball practice venues). From May to June, the university hosted the "2017 World Congress of Sociology of Sport Taiwan." On May 12, Mr. Albert Teo, Ambassador of the Angolan Olympic Committee, visited the university and signed an exchange and cooperation agreement. On August 1, the Sports Injury Prevention Center was renamed the Sports Protection Center. In August, the university hosted swimming and water polo, as well as archery competitions for the 2017 Summer Universiade. | 2018 | From March 27 to September 30, the university hosted the "2018 Asian Games Support! – Women Athletes Special Exhibition," promoting the work of gender equality in sports. On April 18, the university signed an exchange agreement with the University of Bordeaux in France. On August 1, Principal Chiu Ping-Kun assumed office as the university's 10th president, with the appointment letter personally presented by Minister of Education Yeh Jiunn-rong. On August 23, the university's gymnastics team member, "Pommel Horse Prince" Lee Chih-Kai, executed a perfect landing in the 2018 Jakarta Asian Games pommel horse final, earning an exceptionally high score and securing the first gold medal in Asian Games history for the Chinese Taipei gymnastics team. On August 29, alumnus Chang Hao-Cheng from the Department of Martial Arts won a bronze medal in the men's 66kg Kurash event at the 2018 Jakarta Asian Games, marking the first medal for Taiwan in the history of the Kurash World Championships—a significant achievement. In February, the Sports Policy and Social Research Center was established to serve as a bridge between the university as a higher education institution in sports and the nation's policies in humanities and social science research and development. In May, a delegation from the Kasetsart University, a sister school in Thailand, visited the university visited the Slovenian Science Research Center and signed a cooperation agreement.
